Commission Assembles for Annual Meeting
AGING & DISABILITY ISSUES: WHAT LEGISLATIVE STAFF NEED TO KNOW FOR 2024

*The event will feature brief presentations from multiple subject matter experts
Addressing the needs of older adults and individuals with disabilities in California*

SACRAMENTO --- The California Commission on Aging (CCoA) is convening for a General Meeting in Sacramento on January 25, 2024, to hold its annual legislative primer. The meeting will be held from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at 2880 Gateway Oaks Dr., Suite 395 in Sacramento, and in a hybrid format to accommodate those who wish to attend remotely on Zoom.

Legislative staff are invited to jumpstart the legislative season with an introduction to the policy world of Aging and Disability. From subject matter experts, learn about critical legislative issues slated for 2024 impacting this growing demographic. The meeting's unique format will include quick, five-minute presentations from key CCoA partners followed by an opportunity for the public to make comments and ask questions.
